## Paul Biya Winner - Tchiroma Victor

In the days ahead, Paul Biya, the world's oldest president at 92, will officially begin yet another seven-year mandate, cementing a reign that has now spanned an astonishing 42 years. He is the declared winner, but controversy continues to surround his victory with many across the country

believing Tchiroma is the true winner. Civil society groups have widely condemned the election as a brazen electoral heist, plunging the nation into a fresh crisis of legitimacy. Tchiroma, whose dramatic resignation from government just weeks before the poll ignited a groundswell of

support and saw him sweep key regions, now, finds himself not only deprived of official victory but also facing the interior minister's ominous threat of prosecution for allegedly triggering violent riots. Lives have been lost and

hundreds arrested across the country. The economic fallout is immediate and devastating: Douala, the nation's economic heart, lies grounded for two days, while rioting youths paralyze Garoua, Tchiroma's northern stronghold.
